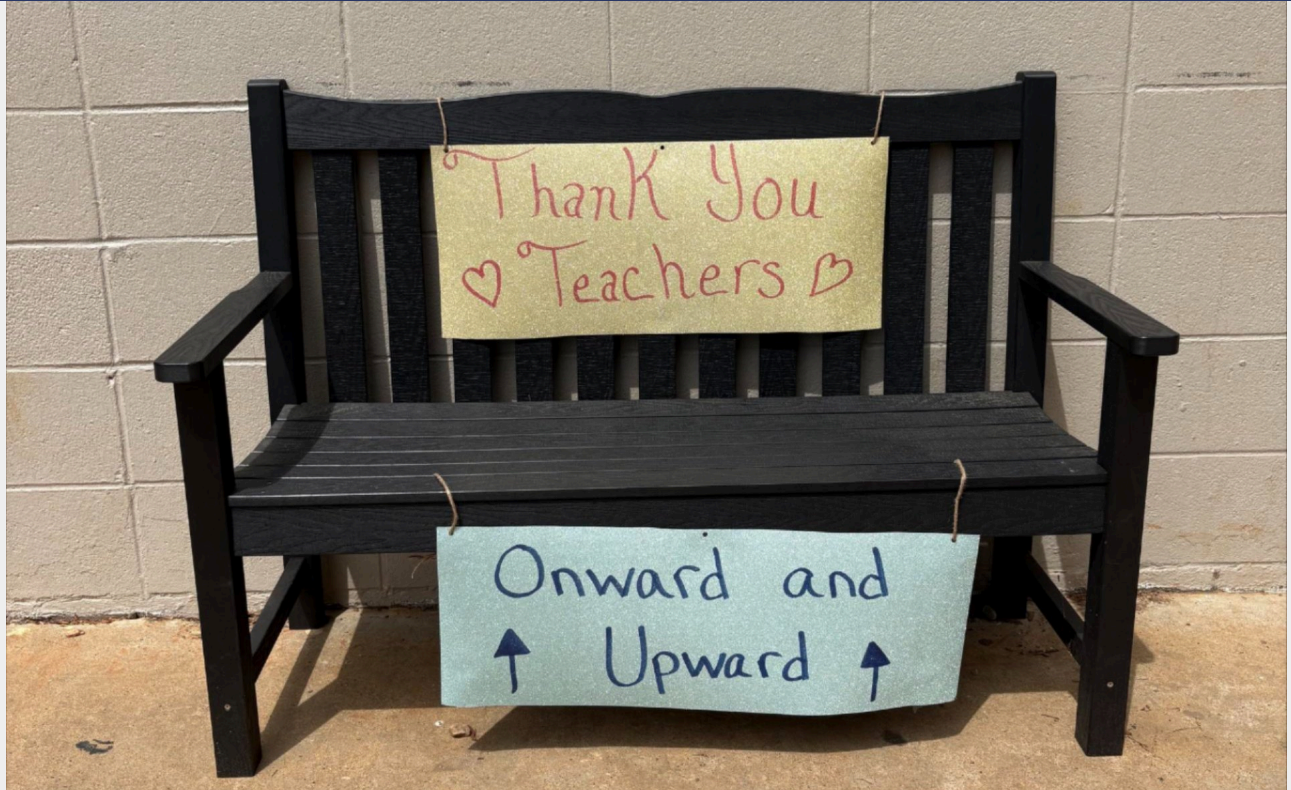

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PowerSchool Access

If you are having trouble accessing your student's PowerSchool account, please email Ms. Delgado. Please note that some issues, due to the transition, might take longer to fix and we appreciate your patience at this time.

Student Intent-to-Return

We need to resend our Student Intern-to-Return form once things on the backend of PowerSchool are fixed. Every family *must* complete this form and click yes or no, even if your student is not returning. This will help us access our enrollment numbers for next year, and we will send a standalone email once the email is sent out.

Please note that only the parent or guardian who enrolled the student will receive the email from PowerSchool. If you are unable to log in to PowerSchool after clicking the link in the email, you must reset the password yourself, as the form itself is in a different account than the one you use for accessing grades and attendance.

Uniforms

Lands' End is no longer selling our old uniform. However, students are still expected to follow our uniform guidelines for the daily and formal attire for the rest of the year. If a student needs new clothes, they can take what they need from our donation rack. Parents may also purchase new clothes from a brand of their choosing, but they *must* adhere to the following guidelines:

- **Daily Attire**
 - A plain gray polo with a collar and no visible logos
 - Navy sweaters for outerwear with no visible logos
 - Plain navy pants, shorts, or skirts
- **Formal Attire**
 - A long-sleeve or short-sleeve white button-up shirt with no visible logos
 - Plaid skirts or jumper for with the cross tie for girls
 - Plain navy pants for boys and a tie for boys
